

KIOGA Requests Members to Complete Methane Emissions Survey

KIOGA is supporting the industry effort to bring reason to federal regulations on methane emissions. One of our goals is to improve understanding of the impact of the burdensome EPA methane emission requirements on marginal wells.

The Obama-EPA removed the exclusion of low-producing wells from its fugitive emissions program based on a specious Environmental Defense Fund (EDF) study that characterized small wells as “super emitters”. KIOGA has provided EPA information demonstrating and exposing the mendacity of the flawed EDF study. KIOGA maintained that wells with less production also have fewer emissions.

KIOGA is working with an industry methane coalition to collect data in an effort to bring common sense into the emissions arena. The coalition has developed a survey. The Methane Coalition Survey will be conducted on a company confidential basis and all information aggregated for statistical purposes and inclusion in the commenting submission.
